#### JUDGING PANEL

**Sarah Crowe - Chair of Judges. General Manager, Chief Winemaker, Yarra Yering**After studying and working in Horticulture Sarah began her wine career with vineyard work in the Hunter Valley, and, within three years, she had become Brokenwood's Assistant Winemaker.

Building on her experience Sarah completed International harvests in both Oregon and the Rhone Valley. After 12 years in the Hunter Valley Sarah was looking for a new challenge when the job opportunity at Yarra Yering came up.

Sarah made the move to the Yarra Valley joining the team in 2013 to focus on one single iconic vineyard site. The vineyard is central to wine quality and Sarah considers the Yarra Yering vineyard to be the best she has ever worked with.

The release of her first wines, the 2014 vintage saw her named James Halliday's Winemaker of the Year 2017. Now in the role of Winemaker and General Manager, Sarah continues to build on the reputation started in 1969 with the first vineyard plantings at Yarra Yering.

She has been the recipient of an unprecedented four top awards this year: Gourmet Traveller Wine Magazine's Winemaker of the Year (2021), The Real Review Winery of the Year (2021), Halliday Winery of the Year (2022) and Halliday Wine of the Year (2022).

#### Matt Brooke - Director of Wine, Crown Casino

Matt has been a sommelier for over 15 years, working at some of Melbourne and Brisbane's most prestigious restaurants along the way gaining several awards such for Wine List of the Year at Brooks, Ortiga and Circa. Matt has also been heavily involved in Sommeliers Australia currently sitting on the National committee.

Gaining judging experience at shows like the National Wine Show in Canberra and regional shows like McLaren Vale, Clare Valley, Yarra Valley gained Matt a coveted place at the 2014 Len Evans Tutorial where he came away as Dux of the program. Since then he has been working as Director of Wine at Crown Melbourne, and is also one half of Athletes of Wine, a small wine brand he produces with good friend, Liam O'Brien, in the Macedon Ranges.

#### Alister Timms - Chief Winemaker, Shadowfax

No stranger to the world of winemaking and viticulture, Alister grew up on his family's vineyards on the Bellarine Peninsula and was planting vines at the age of 10. With a science degree from Melbourne University, Alister went on to study Oenology at the University of Adelaide and graduated in 2001.

Alister then started working at Shadowfax as Assistant Winemaker, a position he held for three years before moving back home to run his family's winery Kilgour Estate. In 2008, Alister returned to Shadowfax to manage the winery's various vineyards and established the Little Hampton property in the Macedon Ranges, whilst working as Assistant Winemaker to Matt Harrop. He took over as Chief Winemaker in October 2017.

Alister has achieved outstanding success at Shadowfax and has been an integral part of many prestigious wine awards over the past 18 years. He leads a small team of young wine professionals and enthusiasts who share the same passion... to simply create great wine.

#### WINES OF PROVENANCE

We introduced a new trophy this year, Best Wines of Provenance. This class allows winemakers to enter three vintages of one of their wines, across a five-year span. All varieties compete. It has allowed the judges to look at consistency of excellence and longevity - a longer-term barometer of the vineyard and winemaker's expertise.

We're proud to have Farmer's Daughters sponsoring this award. This highly regarded Melbourne restraurant opened in this most challenging of years, and continues to champion Gippsland produce and feature many Gippsland wines.


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
